The Gospel As Seen in the life of Abraham

God's promises and covenants with Abraham typify the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The hope of Abraham and of the nations for salvation depends on God fulfilling His promises to give a son. (Gen. 15:1-6; Luke 2:28-32)

The births of Isaac and Jesus are miraculous (Gen. 17:15-18; 18:12-14; Matt. 1:18-25)

However both sons have to die and be raised from the dead before they can fulfill their missions, Isaac in type, Jesus literally (Heb. 11:19)

God enacts His covenant with Abraham in connection with a sacrifice (Gen. 15:18)

God initiates the New Covenant with the Church through the sacrificial act of crucifixion of Jesus (Luke 22:20)

Circumcision is the sign of Abraham's covenant (Gen. 17); the communion cup is the sign of the New Covenant (Luke 22:20)

Abraham has to leave his home to establish his community as a group of aliens and sojourners (Gen. 12:1)

The church today confesses itself to have its citizenship in heaven and not of this world (John 15:19; Phil. 3:20)

Finally, both Abraham and the Church are founded on the future hope of a new heaven and earth (Heb. 11:39-40)
