THE SIX SONS OF KETURAH...

...As these sons' names prophetically suggest the history of the gentile nations in relationship to Israel and Israel's Messiah *during the Millennial Age.*The Millennial Age is the thousand year reign of Christ on earth following His return and until the coming of the New Heavens and the New Earth.

ZIMRAM = 'singer' or 'song'. That is how the millennial age will begin. It will begin with songs of praise to the Lord for all that He has done for the earth. Isaac Watt's hymn will come into its own: Joy to the world, the Lord is come, let earth receive her King!" From pole to pole the redeemed nations will sing the praises of the Lamb.

The unleashing of Satan from the abyss will give those abandoned ones a rallying point for their smoldering rebellion.
